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

Vandal resistant dome cover.

2. Tamper resistant screws

Star-shaped captive screws to fix the dome cover to the base.

3. IR illuminator


Provides scene illumination in the IR spectrum.

4. Microphone

Built-in audio receiver.

1. Dome cover

Vandal resistant dome cover.

2. IR contacts

Align the IR contacts when installing the dome cover to the base. The contacts must be connected to use the IR illuminators.

3. microSD card slot

Accepts a microSD card for onboard storage. For more information, see *(Optional) Configuring microSD Card Storage* on page 10.

4. Auxiliary cable connector

Accepts an auxiliary connection for connecting the camera to auxiliary power, audio and I/O devices.

5. Auxiliary cable entry hole

An entry hole for the auxiliary cable.

6. Ethernet cable entry hole

An entry hole for the Ethernet cable.

7. Ethernet port

Internal View 2

Accepts an Ethernet connection to a network. Server communication and image data transmission occurs over this connection. Also receives power when it is connected to a network that provides Power over Ethernet.

8. Link LED indicator

Indicates if there is an active connection in the Ethernet port.


9. Connection status LED indicator

Provides information about device operation. For more information, see *Connection Status LED Indicator* on page 36.

10. Lanyard

Anchors the dome cover to the camera base.

Bottom View



1. Primary mounting slot

The primary mounting point for the camera.

If using the optional mounting bracket or NPT adapter, align the primary camera post (largest diameter post) with the primary mounting slot.

Note: If you are planning to mount the camera on a wall, be aware that the primary mounting slot aligns with the top of the video image.

2. Secondary mounting slots

Mounting points for the camera.

If you are using the optional mounting bracket or NPT adapter, align the camera posts to the mounting slots.


3. Cable entry holes

An entry holes for the cables required for camera operation.

4. Serial number tag

Device information, product serial number and part number label.

1. Primary camera post

Align the primary camera slot on the optional bracket to the primary mounting post on the dome camera base.

2. Secondary camera posts

Bracket View 4

Align the camera posts on the bracket to the mounting slots on the dome camera base.


3. Cable entry notch

An entry notch for network, power and I/O cables.

4. Mounting slots

Mounting points for the optional bracket.

NPT Adapter View



1. Lock nut

Lock nut for securing the NPT adapter to the pipe.

2. 1-1/2" NPT thread mount

Standard female 1-1/2" NPT thread mount for mounting the dome camera to a pole or bracket.

3. Primary camera post

Align the primary camera slot on the NPT adapter to the primary mounting post on the dome camera base.

4. Secondary camera posts

Align the camera posts on the adapter to the mounting slots on the dome camera base.

Required Tools and Materials

The following tools are required to complete the installation but are not included in the package:

If you will be installing the NPT adapter (H4F-MT-NPTA), you will need:

- 1-1/2" NPT female to female adapter
- NPT pipe
- NPT lock nut

Camera Package Contents

If you are using the optional NPT adapter (H4F-MT-NPTA), ensure the package contains the following:

- NPT adapter for the H4 Fisheye Dome Camera
- 1 x (M3 x 8 mm) T10 star-shaped screw for securing the camera base to the bracket.
- Thread seal tape



Installation


Removing the Dome Cover

1. From the bottom of the dome camera, remove the white plug covering the Ethernet cable entry hole. Once removed, the plug can be discarded.

Be aware that a vacuum may occur within the camera during shipping. Removing the plug may allow the dome cover to be removed more easily.



2. Remove the dome cover by loosening the screws that fix the cover to the base. Use the provided star-shaped screwdriver to loosen the screws.



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Note: Be careful not to scratch or touch the dome bubble. The resulting marks or fingerprints may affect the overall image quality. Keep the protective covers on the outside of the dome bubble until the installation is complete.

Preparing the Cables


Before you connect the cables to the dome camera, you must prepare the cables for installation.

If the dome camera is installed outdoors, it is important that the cables be insulated against the weather. Provided with the dome camera is a rubber grommet for waterproofing the Ethernet cable, and a rubber washer for the auxiliary cable.

Note: The Ethernet cable must be uncrimped to perform this procedure.

The auxiliary cable that is provided with the dome camera includes an I/O terminal, external power connector, audio input and audio output connectors. You need to connect the auxiliary cable to the dome camera if any one of the auxiliary cable connectors is used. For more information about each of the connector options, see *Auxiliary Cable Connections* on page 33.


- 1. Thread the Ethernet cable into the rubber grommet.
 - a. Drill a hole through the center of the provided rubber grommet.




b. Push the cable through the hole in the rubber grommet.

Ensure the orientation of the cable and grommet matches the following image.



c. Crimp the connector onto the Ethernet cable.



2. If you are using the auxiliary cable, thread the rubber washer through the end with the white connectors.

3. Do not connect the cables to the dome camera till indicated.

(Optional) Configuring microSD Card Storage

To use the camera's SD card storage feature, you must insert a microSD card into the card slot.

It is recommended that the microSD card have a write speed of class 10 or better. If the microSD card does not meet the recommended write speed, the recording performance may suffer and result in the loss of frames or footage.

1. Insert a microSD card into the camera.



CAUTION — Do not force the microSD card into the camera or you may damage the card and the camera.


2. Access the camera's web interface to enable the onboard storage feature. For more information, see the Avigilon High Definition H4 and H5 IP Camera Web Interface User Guide.

(Optional) Enabling the Microphone

This dome camera features an internal microphone, and newer models include a switch to physically enable or disable the microphone. The microphone switch is set to OFF by default.

It is recommended that you enable the microphone before installing the camera in its final location.

1. Locate the microphone controller on the dome cover assembly.



2. Slide the switch from the default OFF position to ON to enable the microphone.

Mounting the Dome Camera

The dome camera can only be mounted to a pendant wall mount (H4-MT-WALL1) or a pendant NPT mount (H4-MT-NPTA1). The mounts are sold separately.

Use the pendant wall mount if you will be mounting the camera to a vertical mounting surface such as a wall. Use the pendant NPT mount if you will be mounting the camera to a 1-1/2" NPT pipe for a free hanging installation.


Mounting the Dome Camera to a Ceiling or Wall

Perform the following steps if the required cables will be coming from inside the mounting surface and the camera will be mounted immediately over the cable hole. Use this procedure on surfaces that can be easily drilled into, and when the cables should be kept out of sight.

If you do not need to use the auxiliary cable, skip the relevant steps.

1. Using the Camera Base Mounting Template, drill 3 pilot holes into the mounting surface.


If you are mounting the camera to a wall, make sure the pilot hole for the primary mounting slot is at the top, or the video image will be rotated.



- 2. Hammer the supplied plastic anchors into the holes.
- 3. Drill the 2 cable entry holes into the mounting surface.
- 4. Pull the required cables through the mounting surface.



5. If you are installing the auxiliary cable, remove the black plug covering the auxiliary cable entry hole. Otherwise, keep the cover on the auxiliary cable entry hole to prevent dust from entering the dome camera.




6. Pull the Ethernet cable through the Ethernet cable entry hole on the camera base. The thread around the grommet should line up with the cable entry hole.


The rubber grommet around the Ethernet cable should be pressed firmly into the Ethernet cable entry hole to create a seal.




7. If you need the auxiliary cable, pull the cable through the auxiliary cable entry hole.



8. Using a wrench or pliers, tighten the auxiliary cable into the camera base.



9. Align the camera base to the pilot holes then use the provided self-tapping screws to secure the camera to the mounting surface.




Mounting the Dome Camera Using the Side Cable Entry Hole

Perform the following steps if the required cables will be run along the mounting surface. Use this procedure if the mounting surface is difficult to drill into, or if the cables must be routed outside of the mounting surface.


If you do not need to use the auxiliary cable, skip the relevant steps.

1. Using the Bracket Mounting Template, drill 3 holes into the mounting surface.


When installing on a wall, the side cable entry hole must point straight down or the video image will be rotated.



- 2. Hammer the supplied plastic anchors into the holes.
- 3. Arrange and feed the required cables through the cable entry notch on the bracket.
- 4. Align the bracket to the mounting holes then use the provided self-tapping screws to secure the mounting bracket to the mounting surface.




5. If you are installing the auxiliary cable, remove the black plug covering the auxiliary cable entry hole. Otherwise, keep the cover on the auxiliary cable entry hole to prevent dust from entering the dome camera.




6. Pull the Ethernet cable through the Ethernet cable entry hole on the camera base. The thread around the grommet should line up with the cable entry hole.


The rubber grommet around the Ethernet cable should be pressed firmly into the Ethernet cable entry hole to create a seal.




7. If you need the auxiliary cable, pull the cable through the auxiliary cable entry hole.



8. Using a wrench or pliers, tighten the auxiliary cable into the camera base.




9. Align the mounting slots on the camera base to the camera posts on the bracket, then twist counterclockwise until the posts come to the right end of the mounting slots.



A tapped hole is now visible through the left side of the primary mounting slot on the camera base.

10. Insert the provided star-shaped screw through the primary mounting slot in the camera base, and into the now visible hole in the mounting bracket.



11. Tighten the screw to lock the camera to the bracket.

Mounting the Dome Camera to an Electrical Box


Perform the following steps if the required electrical components and cables must be contained in an electrical gang box. To mount the dome camera to an electrical gang box, you must use the provided bracket.

If you do not need to use the auxiliary cable, skip the relevant steps.


- 1. Install the electrical gang box as required.
- 2. Align the bracket mounting holes to the mounting points on the electrical gang box.

If you are mounting the camera to a wall, make sure the primary mounting post on the bracket is at the top, or the video image will be rotated.

3. Use the provided machine screws to secure the bracket to the electrical gang box.




4. If you are installing the auxiliary cable, remove the black plug covering the auxiliary cable entry hole. Otherwise, keep the cover on the auxiliary cable entry hole to prevent dust from entering the dome camera.




5. Pull the Ethernet cable through the Ethernet cable entry hole on the camera base. The thread around the grommet should line up with the cable entry hole.


The rubber grommet around the Ethernet cable should be pressed firmly into the Ethernet cable entry hole to create a seal.




6. If you need the auxiliary cable, pull the cable through the auxiliary cable entry hole.



7. Using a wrench or pliers, tighten the auxiliary cable into the camera base.




8. Align the mounting slots on the camera base to the camera posts on the bracket, then twist counterclockwise until the posts come to the right end of the mounting slots.



A tapped hole is now visible through the left side of the primary mounting slot on the camera base.

9. Insert the provided star-shaped screw through the primary mounting slot in the camera base, and into the now visible hole in the mounting bracket.



10. Tighten the screw to lock the camera to the bracket.

(Optional) Mounting the Dome Camera to an NPT Pipe

Perform the following steps if the dome camera needs to be installed to an NPT pipe for a pendant installation. To perform this procedure, you need the optional NPT adapter (H4F-MT-NPTA).


Note: The NPT pipe, adapter, and lock nut are not supplied by Avigilon and should be sourced separately.

If you do not need to use the auxiliary cable, skip the relevant steps.


- 1. Pull the required cable through the NPT conduit pipe.
- 2. Apply thread seal tape to the pipe and screw on the 1-1/2" NPT female to NPT female pipe adapter.
- 3. Screw the lock nut onto the NPT adapter.
- 4. Apply thread seal tape to the NPT adapter and screw it into the pipe adapter.

Make sure the parts are assembled in this order from NPT conduit pipe to camera adapter:

- a. NPT conduit pipe
- b. 1-1/2" NPT female to female pipe adapter
- c. Lock nut
- d. NPT adapter




5. If you are installing the auxiliary cable, remove the black plug covering the auxiliary cable entry hole. Otherwise, keep the cover on the auxiliary cable entry hole to prevent dust from entering the dome camera.




6. Pull the Ethernet cable through the Ethernet cable entry hole on the camera base. The thread around the grommet should line up with the cable entry hole.


The rubber grommet around the Ethernet cable should be pressed firmly into the Ethernet cable entry hole to create a seal.




7. If you need the auxiliary cable, pull the cable through the auxiliary cable entry hole.




9. Align the mounting slots on the camera base to the camera posts on the NPT adapter, then twist counter-clockwise until the posts come to the right end of the mounting slots.



A tapped hole is now visible through the left side of the primary mounting slot on the camera base.

10. Insert the provided star-shaped screw through the primary mounting slot in the camera base, and into the now visible hole in the NPT adapter.




11. Tighten the screw to lock the camera to the bracket.


Connecting Cables

Refer to the diagrams in the Overview section for the location of the different connectors on the camera base.

1. Connect a network cable to the camera's Ethernet port (RJ-45 connector).



2. If the camera is connected to any external devices, connect the auxiliary cable to the auxiliary cable connectors.



- 3. Power the camera using one of the following methods.
 - Power over Ethernet (PoE) Class 3 If PoE is available, the LEDs will turn on.
 - $\bullet\,$ External Power Connect the auxiliary cable to the auxiliary cable connectors.

The status LEDs turn on when the dome camera receives power.

Note: The dome camera may not immediately begin normal operations if the environment is too cold. It may take up to 20 minutes for the dome camera to warm up and begin operations if the temperature is below -25°C (-13°F).

Initializing a Camera Username and Password

Cameras manufactured after January 1, 2020, do not have a default username or password and will be in a factory default state.

Important: You must create a user with administrator privileges before the camera is operational.

The first user can be created using any of the following methods:

- Camera's Web Interface: enter the camera's IP address in a web browser to access the web
 interface. If the camera is in the factory default state you will be redirected to the Add a new user
 page to create the first user. For more information, see the Avigilon High Definition H4 and H5 IP
 Camera Web Interface User Guide.
- Camera Configuration Tool version 1.4.4 or later: cameras discovered in the factory default state will be identified by . Select the **Admin Users** tab to create the first user. For more information, see the *Avigilon Camera Configuration Tool User Guide*.
- Avigilon Control Center software version 7.4 or later, or version 6.14.12 or later: when connecting a
 camera in the factory default state, the client software will ask you to create a new user. For more
 information, see the Avigilon Control Center Client User Guide.
- Avigilon Blue service v3.0 or later: when adding a camera you will be asked to create a new user for cameras in the factory default state. For more information, see the Avigilon Blue Subscriber or Dealer User Guides.

Tip: If you are connecting your Avigilon camera to a 3rd party VMS, you will need to set up the first user through the camera's Web Interface, Camera Configuration Tool, or USB Wifi Adapter before you connect to the 3rd party VMS.

Assigning an IP Address

The device automatically obtains an IP address when it is connected to a network.

Note: If the device cannot obtain an IP address from a DHCP server, it will use Zero Configuration Networking (Zeroconf) to choose an IP address. When set using Zeroconf, the IP address is in the 169.254.0.0/16 subnet.

The IP address settings can be changed using one of the following methods:

- Device's web browser interface: http://<camera IP address>/.
- Network Video Management software application (for example, the Avigilon Control Center™ software).
- ARP/Ping method. For more information, see Setting the IP Address Using the ARP/Ping Method on page 38.

Depending on the manufacture date of your camera, you will have one of the two options below to log in for the first time:



Installing the Dome Cover

Be careful not to touch or scratch the dome bubble. Any marks or fingerprints on the dome bubble may cause unwanted reflections from the IR illuminators.


1. Discard the desiccant pack that is glued to the camera base.




- 2. On the new desiccant pack provided with the camera, remove the adhesive backing and fold down the sides over the adhesive.
- 3. Place the new desiccant pack in the same location as the old pack and make sure it sticks to the camera.
- 4. Attach the dome cover to the base.

Tip: Make sure the IR contacts are aligned to fit the dome cover to the base.

5. Tighten the screws with the star-shaped screwdriver.



6. Remove the plastic cover on the dome bubble.



Auxiliary Cable Connections


The auxiliary cable that is provided with the dome camera includes an I/O terminal, external power connector, audio input and audio output connectors. Connect all the required external devices to the auxiliary cable:



- 1. Connect external input and output devices to the I/O terminal block. External input and output devices can include: door contacts, relays, etc.
 - +3V3 Power, 3.3 V DC, 100 mA max
 - ∘ DO Digital output
 - ∘ DI Digital input
 - GND Ground
- 2. If the camera will be using external power, connect a 12 V DC, 2.125 A min. polarized power adapter to the black power connector.

Note: Do not connect external power if you are powering the dome camera by PoE.

- o Positive on the center pin
- 5.5 mm outer diameter
- o 2.1 mm inner diameter
- 3. Connect an external microphone or a line level input to the pink audio input connector. It accepts a 3.5 mm audio connector.



Pin	Purpose
1	Audio IN Left*
2	Audio IN Right*
3	GND

^{*} Left and right audio channels are internally connected.

4. Connect a PA system or speaker with a built in amplifier to the green line level audio output connector. It accepts a 3.5 mm audio connector.

1	Audio OUT Left*
2	Audio OUT Right*
3	GND

^{*} Left and right audio channels are internally connected.

5. Connect the white connector heads directly to the camera I/O connector. This will allow the camera to use the auxiliary cable connections.

Configuring the Microphone

The H4 Fisheye Dome Camera features two microphones: a built-in microphone and an external audio input.

After you've connected the required microphones, you can configure the microphones or line level audio input from the camera web interface or in the ACC Client software.

- In the camera web interface, the microphones are configured from the Microphone page. You can adjust the microphone volume by changing the gain.
 - **Internal Microphone Gain** configures the gain for the microphone that is built into the camera.
 - **External Source Gain** configures the gain for any line level audio input that is connected to the pink audio input connector on the auxiliary cable.

Configuring the Microphone 34

- In the ACC Client software, the microphones are configured in the Microphone dialog box that can be accessed from the camera's Setup tab. You can adjust the microphone volume by changing the gain and link the audio to other cameras in the site.
 - **External Input** configures the gain for any line level audio input that is connected to the pink audio input connector on the auxiliary cable.

Connection Status LED Indicator

Once connected to the network, the Connection Status LED indicator will display the progress in connecting to the Network Video Management software.

The following table describes what the LED indicator shows:

Connection State	Connection Status LED Indicator	Description
Obtaining IP Address	One short flash every second	Attempting to obtain an IP address.
Discoverable	Two short flashes every second	Obtained an IP address but not connected to the Network Video Management software.
Upgrading Firmware	Two short flashes and one long flash every second	Updating the firmware.
Connected	On	Connected to the Network Video Management software or an ACC™ Server. The default connected setting can be changed to Off using the camera's web user interface. For more information see the Avigilon High Definition H4 and H5 IP Camera Web Interface User Guide.

Resetting to Factory Default Settings

If the device no longer functions as expected, you can choose to reset the device to its factory default settings.

Use the firmware revert button to reset the device. The firmware revert button is shown in the following diagram:




Figure 1: The reset button on the camera base beside the IR contacts.

- 1. Ensure the camera is powered on.
- 2. Remove the dome cover.
- 3. Press and hold the reset button.
- 4. Release the button when the LEDs beside the reset button turn off.

Wait while the dome camera reverts to the factory default settings.

Setting the IP Address Using the ARP/Ping Method

Complete the following steps to configure the camera to use a specific IP address:

- 1. Locate and make note of the MAC Address (MAC) listed on the Serial Number Tag for reference.
- 2. Open a Command Prompt window and enter the following commands:

    For example: arp -s 192.168.1.10 00-18-85-12-45-78
    b. ping -l 123 -t <New Camera IP Address>
    For example: ping -l 123 -t 192.168.1.10
```

- 3. Reboot the camera.
- 4. Close the Command Prompt window when you see the following message:

```
Reply from <New Camera IP Address>: ...
```

Cleaning

Dome Bubble

If the video image becomes blurry or smudged in areas, it may be because the dome bubble requires cleaning.

To clean the dome bubble:

- Use hand soap or a non-abrasive detergent to wash off dirt or fingerprints.
- Use a microfiber cloth or non-abrasive fabric to dry the dome bubble.

Important: Failure to use the recommended cleaning materials may result in a damaged or scratched dome bubble. A damaged dome bubble may negatively impact image quality and cause unwanted IR light reflecting into the lens.

- Use a dry or lightly dampened cloth to clean the camera body.
- Do not use strong or abrasive detergents.
